DOG RACES RULES & REGULATIONS

Barking Mad Dog Racing Rules & Regulations

- Participating canines must be real dachshunds/terriers/lazy dogs.
- There are no weight restrictions. All racers must complete this registration form
- Only the canines chosen to race will be allowed access the track at the Barking Mad Races
- **NO SPECTATOR CANINES WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE TRACK**
- Each race will be approximately 30m on the Barking Mad Arena at the A&P Show
- Each participating canine will need to have 2 humans accommodate. Humans must be able to carry and/or catch the dog. One human will carry the racer to the starting line. The other human will stand at the finish line and catch the racing canine.
- All humans will be required to sign a consent waiver releasing Barking Mad/Market Square Group Ltd. from all liabilities and allowing us to use their names and likenesses in promotional advertising.
- The humans may coax their canine(s) with a favorite chew toy, scarf or treat.
- No dog whistles or other whistles will be allowed. Humans must wear shoes on the track.
- Participating canines are not allowed trackside except for their individual race.
- **ALL CANINES** must be on a leash when they are not on the track during the race.
- Humans are responsible to clean up after their dogs.
